I. Introduction

- A. Warfare is an unavoidable part of the Christian life
- B. "Spiritual warfare is a multilevel conflict between good and evil initiated on the supernatural plane with the prehistoric rebellion of Lucifer, and transferred on to the natural plane with the fall of man." Thomas White

B. Christians must be equipped

- "To keep Satan from getting the advantage over us: for we are not ignorant of his wiles and intentions." II Cor. 2:11
- "But (now) I am fearful, lest that even as the serpent beguiled Eve by his cunning, so your minds may be corrupted...." II Cor. 11:3

C. We always approach warfare from a place of victory

II. Three realms

A. Highest heaven – God Almighty, Lord Jesus Christ and the Holy Angels

Holy angels who appear most often in <u>Scripture</u> carry out a variety of tasks—all designed to serve God...

- <u>Worship</u> and praise—This is the main activity portrayed in <u>heaven</u> (<u>Isaiah 6:1-3</u>; <u>Revelation 4-5</u>).
- **Messengers**—They serve as messengers to communicate God's will to men. They helped reveal the <u>law to Moses (Acts 7:52-53)</u>, and served as the carriers of much of the material in <u>Daniel</u>, and <u>Revelation</u>.
- **Guiding**—Angels gave instructions to <u>Joseph</u> about the <u>birth of Jesus (Matthew 1-2)</u>, to the women at the <u>tomb</u>, to <u>Philip (Acts 8:26)</u>, and to <u>Cornelius (Acts 10:1-8)</u>.
- **Providing**—God has used angels to provide physical needs such as <u>food</u> for <u>Hagar</u> (<u>Genesis</u> <u>21:17-20</u>), <u>Elijah</u> (<u>1 Kings 19:6</u>), and Christ after His <u>temptation</u> (<u>Matthew 4:11</u>).
- **Protecting**—Keeping God's people out of physical danger, as in the cases of <u>Daniel</u> and the <u>lions</u>, and his three friends in the <u>fiery furnace (Daniel 3 and 6)</u>.
- **Delivering**—Getting God's people out of danger once they're in it. Angels released the <u>apostles</u> from <u>prison</u> in <u>Acts 5</u>, and repeated the process for <u>Peter</u> in <u>Acts 12</u>.
- Strengthening and encouraging—Angels strengthened Jesus after His temptation (Matt 4:11), encouraged the apostles to keep preaching after releasing them from prison (Acts 5:19-20), and told Paul that everyone on his ship would survive the impending shipwreck (Acts 27:23-25).
- Answering prayer—God often uses angels as His means of answering the prayers of His

people (Daniel 9:20-24; 10:10-12; Acts 12:1-17).

- Caring for believers at the moment of <u>death</u>—In the story of <u>Lazarus</u> and the rich man, we read that angels carried the <u>spirit</u> of Lazarus to"<u>Abraham's bosom</u>"when he died (<u>Luke</u>). <u>16:22</u>
- Executioners—<u>Angels</u> are sometimes used by God to <u>punish sin</u>. An <u>angel</u> of the <u>Lord</u> went forth and smote an <u>Assyrian camp</u> (<u>2 Kings 19:20-34</u>)—"behold, they were all dead corpses." The <u>Assyrian army</u> was annihilated. A destroying <u>angel</u> was sent, but later withheld, to punish <u>David</u> for his <u>vanity</u> in taking a <u>census</u> of the great number of his people. At the time of <u>Moses</u> and the <u>Exodus</u>, the <u>Egyptian firstborn</u> where killed by an angel of death.* _{Dr. John Bechtle}

B. Mid-heaven – headquarters of Satan and wicked spirits but accessed also by Holy Angels

- Satan also called Lucifer, (shining one, morning star) was "full of wisdom, and perfect in beauty. You were in Eden the garden of God; every precious stone was your covering, the sardius, topaz, and the diamond, the beryl, the onyx, and the jasper, the sapphire, the emerald, and the carbuncle, and gold.... You were the anointed cherub that covers...you were upon the holy mountain of God; you walked up and down in the midst of the stones of fire. You were blameless in your ways from the day that you were created, till iniquity was found in you... and you have sinned: therefore I will cast you as profane out of the mountain of God...and I will destroy you, O covering cherub, from the midst of the stones of fire. Your heart was lifted up because of your beauty, you have corrupted your wisdom by reason of your brightness. I will cast you to the ground..." Ez. 12b-17
- "How are you fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! How you have been cut down to the ground, you who did weaken the nations! And you said in in your heart, <u>I will</u> ascend into heaven, <u>I will</u> exalt my throne above the stars of God: <u>I will</u> sit also upon the mount of the congregation, in the sides of the north: <u>I will</u> ascend above the heights of the clouds; <u>I will</u> be like the most High. Yet you shall be brought down to hell, to the sides of the pit."Isaiah 14:12-15
- Wicked spirits or demons "For we are not contending against flesh and blood, but against the principalities, against the powers, against the world rules of this present darkness, against the spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places." Eph. 6:12

E. Strongholds and how to destroy them

- Types of Strongholds

 - Personal (See Stronghold handout)

Thoughts lead to emotion, which lead to actions, which lead to a habit, which leads to a

stronghold (way of life)

Steps to break down stronghold

- Recognize
- Confess, repent and renounce the error and sin associated with it
- Pray, binding Satan, pull down the stronghold and cast down false reasoning and loose the truth

Rebuild the stronghold area

- Word Study the Word of God regularly Rom. 12:1-2
- Will By personal decision and guidance by God, the Holy Spirit
- Walk Be a doer of the Word

F. Temptation

- Defined Gr. *Peirasmos* = any outside source that appeals to a weakness in your flesh
- Purpose shows us what we are, where we stand and plays a role in what we will be in the future
- Function to trigger a choice and provoke a definite stand or action. It is our proving ground to step into God's provision.

• Results of Giving In to Temptation

"Then the <u>evil desire</u>, when it has <u>conceived</u>, gives <u>birth to sin</u>, and sin, when it is fully <u>matured</u>, brings forth <u>death</u>." James 1:15

• God's Promise

"For no temptation (no trial regarded as enticing to sin, no matter how it comes or where it leads) has overtaken you and laid hold on you that is not common to man (that is, no temptation or trial has come to you that is beyond human 5

resistance and that is not adjusted and adapted and belonging to human experience, and such as man can bear). But God is faithful (to His Word and to His compassionate nature), and He (can be trusted) not to let you be tempted and tried and assayed beyond your ability and strength of resistance and power to endure, but with the temptation, he will (always) provide the way out (the means of escape to a landing place), that you may be capable and strong and powerful to bear up under it patiently. Therefore, my dearly beloved, shun (keep clear way from, avoid by flight if need be) any sort of idolatry (of loving or venerating anything more than God). I Cor. 10:13 Amplified Bible
